Multi-lingual Education Program Final Report



Garden Acres Mutual Water Company is implementing the Nyeland Acres Saves Water Education Program to help Nyeland Acres residents of all ages learn about water, including where it comes from, how we use it, and how to conserve it. Water is our most precious resource, and we must conserve it for our future generations. Garden Acres and Nyeland Acres Mutual Water Companies are working on educating residents about their water.

**Project Abstract:** The SWAN project has three phases and Garden Acres. Phase 1 is to construct a back-up well site, Phase 2 is the replacement of aging infrastructure, and Phase 3 is a multi-lingual education component to increase awareness of water related issues the County faces.

Our goals are to build a strong, resilient and sustainable water system to deliver safe and reliable drinking water to our residents, reduce and eliminate any potential waste of water, and bolster drought resilience.



GAMWC developed and implemented the Nyeland Acres Saves Water multi-lingual education program which enhanced the public's knowledge and awareness of water issues. Nyeland Acres Saves Water was a program that was implemented in English, Spanish, and Mixteco. GAMWC aimed to target all residents in Nyeland Acres and conducting the educational outreach in the native language of residents was key to get the message across. This program focused on raising water education equity in the severely disadvantaged community of Nyeland Acres. Following the third consecutive year of drought in California, it is essential that all residents learn about the


importance of water conservation and being water wise. Nyeland Acres Saves Water raised awareness on conserving water for future generations.

**Project Outcomes:** The Nyeland Acres Saves Water Program was developed with the goal in mind to engage residents to be part of the program. During the duration of the program, GAMWC collaborated with Nyeland Acres Mutual Water Company (the other water company serving our community) to execute the education program. It was essential that the two local water companies in Nyeland Acres work together to reach all 3,300 residents in Nyeland Acres.

GAMWC first measured the resident's existing knowledge by creating a pre-survey on water related topics. Based on the results, GAMWC tailored the program to raise water education equity for our audience.

The pre-survey asked important questions such as, if residents knew where their tap water came from, the amount of water lost through leaks, ways to conserve water, etc. Our intern built trust with residents and had 30 residents complete the pre-survey and post-survey which showed significant results.

The post-survey results showed that 85% of residents knew where their tap water came from compared to only 50% before the implementation of the program. Also, 75% of residents reduced their outdoor watering to only once a week to support drought efforts because of this educational program.




10) How much water does the average person use per day?





GAMWC created culturally tailored materials for the residents of Nyeland Acres.

- The materials were distributed in various ways including via mail, social media, robo texts, lawn signs, banners, one on one outreach, and flyers.
- Residents received a utility bill insert in their monthly water bill educating them about simple ways to conserve water at home.
- Every week 225 residents enrolled in robo text notifications received water conservation tips.
- To reach a more diverse audience, GAMWC was very active on social media posting water education and sharing other relevant information.
- The monthly newsletter reached an audience of 240 subscribers to share water education updates. More than 600 families received information about the Nyeland Acres Saves Water program at the bimonthly food pantry. (See exhibit 1 for more materials)





The GAMWC website was updated regularly during the duration of the program. GAMWC created a page exclusively for water education related topics including a multi-lingual video created by our intern to educate residents on simple ways to conserve water. Our residents were very grateful for the video that was presented to them in their native language. (See exhibit 2 for video links)



During the summer, GAMWC took a bus full of children on two educational field trips. The first stop was at the United Water Conservation District's Freeman Diversion Dam. Children learned about the water cycle, sources of water, water issues, and received a tour by a water treatment operator. Then, the group of children headed to the Ventura Aquatic Center where they received a presentation on water conservation by Ventura Water and took a tour of the facility.





GAMWC coordinated two community clean-ups to raise awareness of maintaining our stormwater drains to minimize the amount of trash and pollutants that end up in our oceans. Resident volunteers came out to assist in picking up bulky items to properly dispose of them. Residents focused on picking up trash along a very busy road with a lot of storm drains. There were volunteers of all ages that picked up 30 bags of trash.







GAMWC also planned and coordinated a Water Awareness Festival to educate and raise awareness about water conservation. We collaborated with other organizations to make this event a success for our community. The 200 Nyeland Acres residents that attended received a lot of valuable information and many conservation devices to conserve water.



When watering plants do it early in the morning or in the evening to reduce evaporation.


